Dear Ms. Lawrence:

On February 1, 2016, the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) received an NOI and supporting documents for the above-referenced City. On June 30, 2016, DEQ completed administrative review of your submittals. DEQ also received the additional information on January 13, 2017. Pursuant to OAC 252:004-7-8, DEQ completed technical review of your NOI and supporting documents. As a part of the public participation process, DEQ will initiate a 30-day public comment period from January 26, 2017 to February 24, 2017 to allow the public to review and comment on the submitted NOI and supporting documents. A copy of your NOI and supporting documents will be available for public review at DEQ's central office and on it's website at [www.deq.state.ok.us](http://www.deq.state.ok.us).

You should also make available a copy of the NOI and all the supporting documents that was submitted to DEQ at a public place such as Town Hall/City Office, Courthouse or Public Library located within your county accessible to public for review and comment. In addition, you are required to comply with State and local public notice requirements as a part of the public participation and involvement process pursuant to Part IV.C.2.a of OKR04 Permit. Persons wishing to file comments and/or request that DEQ hold a public meeting are required to do so in writing to DEQ during the public comment period. A formal public meeting may be scheduled if there is a significant degree of public interest.

Once the public comment period is expired, DEQ will notify you if comments are received and ask you for necessary changes in the Stormwater Management Program. If no comments are received, DEQ will issue the authorization.
