Emergency Management Order

In response to the Disaster Emergency Proclamation issued March 18, 2020, related to the COVID-19 Virus pandemic, the following order is necessary to protect life and property. **This order is effective as of 9:00 p.m. on March 24, 2020, and remains in effect until 8:00 a.m. April 17, 2020, unless revised, rescinded, or amended.**


1. Restaurants, food courts, cafes, coffeehouses, and other places of public accommodation offering food and beverage are closed for dine-in customers and guests and for on-premises consumption, are restricted and limited to curbside, drive-thru, takeout and delivery services, excluding institutional or in-house food cafeterias that serve residents, employees, and clients of businesses, child care facilities, hospitals, and long-term care facilities.
2. Tattoo shops, massage therapist, barber shops, haircut and styling shops, spas, and nail salons may operate only under the following conditions: by appointment only with no walk-in customers; appointments may not be scheduled and held within 15 minutes of the preceding appointment; clients may not bring any other person, including children, into the facility during an appointment; and workstations must have a minimum of six feet of space from adjoining workstations to promote social distancing.
3. The following commercial establishments and places of public accommodation are closed to ingress, egress, use, and occupancy by members of the public:
  - a. Bars, taverns, brew pubs, breweries, microbreweries, distilleries, wineries, tasting rooms, clubs, and other places of public accommodation offering alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption.
  - b. Theaters, cinemas, indoor and outdoor performance venues, and museums.
  - c. Gymnasiums, fitness centers, recreation centers, indoor sports facilities, indoor exercise facilities, exercise studios, and similar facilities.
  - d. Amusement parks, arcades, bingo halls, bowling alleys, indoor climbing facilities, skating rinks, trampoline parks, and other similar recreational or entertainment facilities.
4. This order does not prohibit employees, contractors, vendors, or suppliers of a place of public accommodation from entering, exiting, using, or occupying that place of public accommodation in their professional capacity.
5. This order does not apply to any of the following:
  - a. Places of public accommodation that offer food and beverage not for on-premises consumption, including grocery stores, markets, convenience stores, pharmacies, drug stores, and food pantries, other than those portions of the place of public accommodation subject to the requirements of section 1:
  - b. Health care facilities, child care facilities, residential care facilities, congregate care facilities, and juvenile justice facilities;
  - c. Crisis shelters, soup kitchens, or similar institutions.
6. For purposes of this order, "place of public accommodation" means a business, or an education, refreshment, entertainment, or recreation facility, or an institution of any kind, whether licensed or not, whose goods, services, facilities, privileges, advantages, or accommodations are extended, offered, sold, or otherwise made available to the public.
7. The public should follow the CDC, White House, and OSDH guidelines for social distancing and limit gatherings of more than 10 people.
